The lowa Legislature is now in session and the lowa Auto Recyclers are already on the hill making headway with this year's legislative initiative.

This year is mainly a follow up to the Iowa NMVTIS reporting law that was passed successfully in 2015. Those rules have still not been written nor published for public comment by the Iowa DOT. We suspect mainly due to some language that was struck from the bill that passed into law that is making is very difficult for the rules to be written.

Auto and metal recyclers have agreed on language changes and suggestions made to the lowa DOT based on the "pre-draft" that we were asked to review.

Our "ask" for the 2017 session is basically some cleanup language and clarification that will make the rule writing possible for the lowa DOT to finish up soon, despite the staffing changes at DOT. See page 17! As always it will be an interesting spring and we will be putting out more

# **Board of Directors Meeting**

December 13, 2016—Des Moines

Members present: Brad Osborn, Sue Schauls, Tom Quandt, Pat Rooff, Jordan Barkow, Mike Garvin, Brent Nugent, David Hesmer, Mike Swift, Jodi Kunde and Jeff Smid.

President Brad Osborn called the meeting to order at 5:20 pm and reminded everyone of the Anti-Trust Statement. Roll call was taken.

#### **New Business**

Jim Piazza's Contract – Joel, Brad and Sue met with Jim to iron out the details of Jim's 2017 contract. After their meeting, Jim drafted the contract and sent it back to them to review. It was as discussed and agreed upon. The legislative committee members have been receiving more updates from Jim through emails since their meeting. Following some discussion, David H. made a motion to accept Jim Piazza's contract as proposed and written with a second from Mike S. Motion carried.

<u>Legislative Priorities</u> – Sue asked for the IAR PAC to donate \$1,000 to the ARA PAC to help them with the work they are doing. She would like to make this an annual donation which would be written into the IAR budget. She and Mike S. reported on issues the ARA is working on to benefit all of us:

OEM recall parts data needs rules written to provide electronic date in batch form for integration to our inventory systems.

Provide all parts data so VIN lookup can take place at point of sale.

Jodi made a motion to approve a \$1,000 donation to the ARA PAC from the IAR PAC. It was seconded by Jordan; motion carried.

It was suggested to come up with a PAC mailer to send out to the IAR membership informing them of what's going on legislatively. Sue proposed that Jordan and Jodi help her get information together so she can design the mailer with the plan to send it out by the end of the year in advance of the opening lowa legislative session.

Mike S. asked about a parts display at the 2017 Hill Day on Feb. 8th. Sue said she would work on putting that together using 10 parts.

The "I heart used auto parts" stickers have had a good response so it was suggested to order more and then

2016 lowa NMVTIS Bill – Sue said LKQ has language put together to help states get their own NMVTIS program trying to get all states on board. There was a lot of discussion on the pros and cons, junking certificates, etc. but basically lowa needs to finish writing the language for the lowa NMVTIS bill which would allow licensed recyclers to report to the lowa NMVTIS in lieu of junking certificates and to add a lien check and NMVTIS check for no title purchases.

New Membership Type – Sue asked about adding a new level of membership to the current Direct & Associate Members. This new level would offer information (through emails only) for a lower cost of \$75 (estimate) per year to R-licensed used car dealers, rebuilders and body shops and

#### IOWA AUTO RECYCLERS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

#### **APPLICANT CRITERIA:**

- Be a graduating high school senior or equivalent, or a college student who has been accepted to an accredited university, state college, community college, business or liberal arts school
- A minimum 3.0 GPA during high school or first year college.
- Applicants (or their eligible dependent/relative) must be affiliated with the lowa Auto Recyclers Association to participate. EITHER:
  - Be a recycling yard owner or relative of the recycling yard owner who is a direct member of the lowa Auto Recyclers. The owner of the recycling yard must be employed at the recycling yard, and not at other enterprises owned by the recycling yard.
    - "Relatives" may include a son, daughter, grandchild, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, or spouse of the owner.
    - Brothers, sisters, uncles, aunts, nieces, or nephews of the owner will not be eligible to participate unless employed in the business.

OR

- Be an employee or dependent of an employee of the member yard who has been employed for one year or more.
- Applicant must remain a degree-seeking student, enrolled at least full-time (a minimum of 12 credit hours per term).

#### **APPLICANT GUIDELINES:**

- Complete attached application, download at www.lowaAutoRecyclers.com under SCHOLARSHIP
- Enclose an official copy of the applicants' high school transcripts (in separate sealed envelope) with application.
- Include a one to two page essay on one of the following topic:

# Do you think the future technology of vehicle to vehicle communications (V2V) will affect today and future drivers for the better or worse?

- Two recommendation forms filled out from a school counselor, school official, employer or high school teacher who is familiar with the applicant.
- Applicants must remain enrolled in the same accredited four-year college, accredited university, state college, community college or business or liberal arts school for at least one year after accepting scholarship funds to be eligible for the full award.
- Obtain a letter from your parents' employer confirming date of hire with the firm. Your parent must have been or will be employed with a full member of the lowa Automotive Recyclers for at least one year prior to application.

Up to \$5000.00 will be awarded in scholarships for the fall term. The winners will be notified in writing in April and will be posted on the IAR website.

The scholarship award check will be forwarded to the scholarship recipient's school upon written certification of his/her enrollment for the fall term of the year the scholarship was granted. If the scholarship winner does not provide enrollment verification for the fall term the scholarship monies will be forfeited.

**SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION:** The scholarship will be awarded based on review of the following: course work in high school, course distribution, activities, the one page essay and recommendations. *Standardized test scores will NOT be used as a factor in the selection process.*

# What is Volkswagen Doing with All Those Repurchased Diesels?

EPA caught Volkswagen, the German automaker, using a "defeat device," an algorithm that detected when the car was being tested and changed its performance to meet emissions standards. The rest of the time, the cars produce up to 40 times the legal limit of nitrogen oxides (NOx), the stuff linked to increased rates of asthma and respiratory problems.

The problem applies to 482,000 diesel-powered, four-cylinder Jetta, Beetle, Audi A3, and Golf cars sold between 2008 and 2015 in the US, and to Passat cars sold from 2014 to 2015. VW'S September 2015 confession that it illegally programed software in 11

million diesel-powered cars (worldwide) to cheat on emissions tests comes with the sting of betrayal for owners. <sup>2</sup>

The TDI badge stands for "Turbocharged Direct Injection" and was promoted as TDI Clean Diesel. "After years of promoting 'Clean Diesel' as an alternative to hybrid and electric vehicles—the compa-

ny marched on Washington with a squadron of Audi TDI models—is stewing in its own toxic vapors. "<sup>3</sup>

By October 18, 2016, over 340,000 VW owners and lessees had sent in registration forms indicating they want the company to buy back their cars under the government-negotiated compensation agreement. That is about 3/4 of all 475,000 Volkswagen and Audi models with 2.0-liter diesel engines currently registered on U.S. roads. TDI owners and lessees still on the fence have another 22 months to decide.<sup>1</sup>

Will VW crush every car? Volkswagen can't resell the cars it buys; nor can it export them to other countries without modifying them to be EPA compliant. Since there is no EPA-approved modification—Volkswagen has multiple deadlines through October

2017 by which it must submit final modification proposals—the cars must be "rendered inoperable" by removing their the engine control unit (ECU). The rest of the car can be scrapped for parts, and those parts can be resold here or abroad, including the engines. Only the ECU, the diesel oxidation catalyst, and the diesel particulate filter must be destroyed on each car.<sup>1</sup>

Once VW dealers take the cars, the factory will truck the TDIs to undisclosed storage facilities across the country. There is no telling whether Volkswagen will choose to stockpile hundreds of thousands of cars as

it awaits EPA approval or begin stripping them immediately. The usedparts supply for latemodel VWs could grow substantially, and prices potentially could fall as a result. <sup>1</sup>

# What about the emissions modification? By the end of 2017, we should know whether VW can start fixing cars

it has repurchased and offer this fix to current owners. That's the best possible scenario. The limbo could easily spill over into 2018, and that's only assuming the EPA and the California Air Resources Board (CARB) will okay the repairs. Emissions modifications, if approved, will be staggered in four stages. Last month, VW was scheduled to submit its final proposal for all 2015 TDI models of the Golf, Golf SportWagen, Jetta, Passat, Beetle, and Audi A3. This, however, is expected to be only an interim fix. By October 30, 2017, VW must submit a second proposal describing how it intends to complete the modifications on these same cars.<sup>1</sup>

ed to document identity and work authorization for each new employee (citizen or any status) hired after November 6, 1986. Employees must complete Section 1 no later than their first day of employment and employers must verify their documents (per the Lists of Acceptable Documents attached to the Form.

The new form, which has been in the works for almost a year, is touted to be a "smart" I-9 because the form contains pop-up informational icons and error-checking capabilities. Presently, the new form is only compatible with Adobe Reader. But it should be emphasized that this is NOT an "electronic" I-9, it still must be physically printed, signed and dated by the employee and the employer and retained per the rules.

This new, "smart" I-9 will provide employers with additional guidance to correctly complete the I-9 and therefore avoid fines. On August 1, 2016, USCIS announced higher fines for I-9 paperwork violations.

Form I-9 is used for verifying the identity and employment authorization of individuals hired for employment in the United States. All U.S. employers must ensure proper completion of Form I-9 for each individual they hire for employment in the United States. This includes citizens and noncitizens. Both employees and must complete the form. On the form, an employee must attest to his or her employment authorization. The employee must also present his or her employer with acceptable documents evidencing identity and employment authorization. The employer must examine the employment eligibility and identity documents an employee presents to determine whether the documents reasonably appear to be genuine and to relate to the employee and record the document information on the Form I-9. The list of acceptable documents can be found on the last page of the form. Employers must retain Form I-9 for a designated period and make it available for inspection by authorized government officers.

Do not file Form I-9 with USCIS or U.S. Immigrations and Customs Enforcement (ICE). Employers must have a completed Form I-9 on file for each person on their payroll who is required to complete the form. Form I-9 must be retained and stored by the employer either for three years after the date of hire or for one year after employment is terminated, whichever is later. The form must be available for inspection by authorized U.S. Government officials from the Department of Homeland Security, Department of Labor, or Department of Justice.

The Spanish version of Form I-9 may be filled out by employers and employees in Puerto Rico ONLY. Spanish-speaking employers and employees in the 50 states and other U.S. territories may print this for their reference, but may only complete the form in English to meet employment eligibility verification requirements.

OSHA updated the recordkeeping rules for injury and illness data recorded by employers effective January 2015. Information previously recorded and kept on-site in case of inspection is now reported to OSHA directly or via a state agency for **certain industries including auto** salvage and metal recyclers.

#### The online form available.

The final rule will improve access by employers, employees, researchers and the public to information about workplace safety and health and increase their ability to identify and abate serious hazards.

Employers (with 10 or more employees) must report the following events to OSHA:

All work-related fatalities within 8 hours.

All work-related inpatient hospitalizations, all amputations and all losses of an eye within 24 hours.

Employers must report work-related **fatalities within 8 hours** of finding out about it, including fatalities occurring within 30 days of the work-related incident, must be reported to OSHA. For any in-patient hospitalization, amputation, or eye loss **employers must report the incident within 24 hours** of learning about it.

#### **Recording requirements:**

The new rule retains the **exemption for any employer with 10 or fewer employ- ees from the requirement.** Employers with ten or more employees had generally been using the OSHA Form 300 to record individual injuries or illnesses occurring in the workplace. These incidents were then summarized on the annual OSHA 300A Log for posting in an employee accessible area.

#### Reminder:

Post the summary OSHA 300A Log February 1 until April 30th each year.

Additionally, **beginning in 2017**, employers with more than 250 employees will report all injury forms electronically. Employers with 20 to 249 employees in certain identified industries, <u>including automotive & metal recycling</u>, must submit their 300A form electronically annually.

If any injuries are summarized on the 300A form it may also be sent to lowa OSH at the above addresses. *Those outside of lowa will report to their state.* 

# OSHA Injury & Illness Reporting Now requires sending 300A Log to OSHA

#### **OSHA 300 Form**

OSHA Form 300 is used to log work-related injuries and illnesses and to note the extent and severity of each case. When an incident occurs, use the OSHA 300 Form or Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses to record specific details about what happened and how it happened. By using the OSHA produced Excel format the incidents reported on the Form 300 will automatically be tallied in the Form 300A for the annual summary.

#### **OSHA 301 Form**

OSHA Form 301 is also used to record work-related injuries and illnesses <u>but is an incident specific form</u>. A new Form 301 would be completed for each injury or illness incident. The information on

Form 301 is what is required to be reported to OSHA or the state program under the updated regulation affective January 2015.

#### **OSHA 300A Log**


The Summary Form 300A shows the totals of recorded events for the year in each category. At year-end, post the 300A Log in a visible location so that employees are aware of the injuries and illnesses occurring in

their workplace. Post the OSHA 300A log in an employee accessible area such as near the Department of Labor required postings. Additionally, auto recyclers must report the OSHA 300 A log to OSHA.

Keep a separate log and summary for each physical location that is expected to be in operation for one year or longer. Listing a case on the log does not mean that the employer or worker was at fault or that an OSHA standard was violated

Automotive Recyclers are categorized under the SIC (Standard Industry Classification) system as 5015 as utilized in stormwater permitting. That category generally stands for "used auto parts wholesale." In the other categorizing system called NAICS (North American Industry Classification System) auto salvage is classified as 423140 with the prefix 42 identifying the industry as a "wholesale trade" one of the identified industry types for annual electronic reporting of the OSAH 300A (Injury Summary Log) in addition to posting it in the workplace. Metal recyclers (SIC 5093 and NAICS 423930) as "Recyclable Merchant Whoelsaler" IS also identified as needing to report OSHA 300A log electronically given the same prefix 42 as auto recyclers.

**Automotive collision repair** (SIC 7532 and NAICS 811121) and **Used car dealers** (Sic 5511 and NAICS 441120) are <u>NOT</u> identified as needing to report OSHA 300A log electronically. *If any one of your businesses/processes are listed then you must report.*
