## Tow Operators are Subject to **NMVTIS** Reporting

What is NMVTIS, exactly? The National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) is a U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) database that contains automobile information from states, insurance carriers and businesses that handle junk and salvage automobiles.

NMVTIS is a national program, and the reporting requirements are separate from your state regulations. It is important to understand the requirements, because it is up to each affected business, not its state, to ensure that the proper reports are made to the national database.

On January 27, 2011, the Department of Justice (DOJ) issued a policy clarification for towing companies regarding the National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS). The clarification explains the federal reporting requirements and provides specific guidance on tow company reporting.

So, do you have to report? In general, if you own, control, handle or acquire more than five junk or salvage vehicles a year, you must report to NMVTIS. The DOJ clarification states that tow companies, wrecker operators and tow truck services are included in the NMVTIS program regulations, and those businesses should be reporting information about the junk and salvage vehicles they handle.





## NMVTIS 101: Federal Reporting Requirements for Tow Companies


What qualifies as a junk or salvage vehicle? According to the federal rule, junk vehicles are vehicles incapable of operating on public streets, roads and highways or have no value except as a source of parts or scrap. These vehicles may be bought and sold in their entirety or as spare parts, used for rebuilding, restoration, or they may be crushed.

Salvage vehicles are automobiles that have been damaged to the extent that the fair salvage value plus the cost of repair for legal operation would be more than the fair market value of the automobile immediately before the damage occurred. The definition of junk and salvage automobiles includes all automobiles declared to be a total loss by a state or an insurance carrier. Please keep in mind that the federal junk/salvage definition does not consider title brands or status— even a car with a "clean" title must be reported if it fits the federal salvage definition.

Tow companies will need to report all junk and salvage vehicles that they purchase from a private party, take possession of in lieu of towing or storage costs or sell at auction. NMVTIS reporting also applies to any vehicle you part out or crush, or any vehicle for which you obtain a salvage certificate, a certificate of destruction or similar document. If you have the right to sell or re-title, rebuild, restore or crush the vehicle, and it is a junk or salvage vehicle under the federal definition, you must report the vehicle to NMVTIS.

What vehicles do NOT have to be reported? Any vehicle that is merely transported or stored, or for which you did not have the right to determine what would happen to the vehicle does not have to be reported. Any vehicle that does not meet the definition of a junk or salvage vehicle should not be reported.

How do you report? NMVTIS reporting is done through approved data consolidators. Consolidators collect the required information from towing companies, format it and insert it into the NMVTIS database. Auto Data Direct or ADD is an approved NMVTIS data consolidator, and offers both paid and no-cost NMVTIS reporting accounts. ADD accounts also include access to other products designed specifically for the towing industry, such as certified mail tools, forms tools and real-time owner/lien holder

searches in seventeen states, including Florida and Texas. For current ADD account holders, simply click on the NMVTIS Vehicle Upload tab to begin reporting.

What do you report? For each junk and salvage vehicle you handle, you will be asked to provide your business contact information, the VIN, the date you obtained the right to determine the vehicle disposition, and who you obtained the vehicle from. Towing reports will include a statement of what will happen to the vehicle (if it will be used for parts or rebuilding, crushed or sold), who purchased the vehicle if it was sold, and if it will be exported out of the US.

Is it too late to begin reporting? If you haven't ever made a NMVTIS report, it's not too late to catch up. The Department of Justice has stated that even if you are late beginning NMVTIS reporting, when you do make your first report, you should include ALL junk and salvage vehicles that you have handled since the regulations went into effect on March 1, 2009.

## Other info

The National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) was created under the Anti Car Theft Act of 1992. In 1996, the Anti Car Theft Act was reauthorized and amended, transferring the responsibility for NMVTIS from the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) to the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ).

Since DOJ became responsible for NMVTIS in 1997, nearly \$33 million in federal funding has been provided to states and the operator of the system, AAMVA, to make the system operational.

Reporting and data retrieval went to an online system on March 2, 2009. Since then, states and industries have been coming into compliance with the federal regulation. Many states, including lowa have also enacted state NMVTIS rules.

The National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) is designed to protect consumers from fraud and unsafe vehicles and to keep stolen vehicles from being resold. NMVTIS is also a tool that assists states and law enforcement in deterring and preventing title fraud and other crimes.

Several businesses and agencies are required to regularly report specific information to NMVTIS. These entities include:

State motor vehicle titling agencies. Insurance carriers (including some self-insuring entities).

Auto recyclers and junk and salvage yards (including scrap vehicle shredders and scrap metal processors, as well as "pull- or pick-apart yards," salvage pools, salvage auctions, and other types of auctions, businesses, and individuals that handle salvage vehicles (including vehicles declared a "total loss")).

These entities are required to report various types of information on vehicles; however, there are some limited exceptions to these reporting requirements (e.g., certain types of recyclers may not be able to identify VINs for reporting, junk or salvage yards handling less than 5 salvage vehicles per year are exempt from reporting).

NOTE: All insurance carriers were required to begin monthly reporting of salvage/total loss data to NMVTIS on March 31, 2009. All auto recyclers, salvage yards, and junk yards were required to begin monthly reporting of salvage vehicle data to NMVTIS on March 31, 2009. ### Iowa NMVTIS Law

Summary of Legislation effective January 1, 2016: Requires a licensed vehicle recycler to register with the National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS). Requires every person who applies for a vehicle recycler license to provide proof of registration with NMVTIS.

So, do you have to report? YES. In general, if you own, control, handle or acquire more than five junk or salvage vehicles a year, you must report to NMVTIS. The DOJ clarification states that tow companies, wrecker operators and tow truck services are included in the NMVTIS program regulations, and those businesses should be reporting information about the junk and salvage vehicles they handle.

## NATIONAL MOTOR VEHICLE TITLE INFORMATION SYSTEM (NMVTIS) ID AND REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR IOWA

HF563 was passed by the Iowa legislature in 2016 that requires:

- Licensed lowa recyclers to register with the NMVTIS
- Every person who applies for an lowa vehicle recycler license to provide proof of registration with NMVTIS
- Every licensed vehicle recycler that is subject to federal reporting requirements to report the acquisition of junk and salvage vehicles to NMVTIS.

The law also provides for criminal and administrative sanctions should a licensed recycler fail to comply with NMVTIS reporting requirements.

Each person who registers with the NMVTIS will be assigned a NMVTIS Reporting ID. It is this ID number that must be provided to the Iowa Department of Transportation as evidence of registration with NMVTIS. Detailed information on reporting requirements and how to obtain a NMVTIS Reporting ID number is available online.

Registering (obtaining an ID) and reporting the acquisition of junk and salvage vehicles must be completed utilizing one of the approved third party consolidators listed below.

## Minnesota to introduce catalytic converter ID system

## State will spend \$400,000 to encourage vehicle owners to have traceable converters.

Minnesota's state government reportedly has earmarked \$400,000 to fund a program to help more vehicle owners placed identifying markers on their catalytic converters in an attempt to thwart some converter theft attempts.

As prices for platinum group metals (PGMs) have risen, the theft of catalytic converters has risen throughout North America. The Minnesota funds will go toward an identification or marking system that was recently endorsed by panelists at an ISRI meeting on the topic.

In Minnesota, the state legislature has agreed to \$400,000 in funding for a new pilot program as part of its next two-year budget, according to an online article on the St. Peter (Minnesota) Herald website.

The program would pay for car owners to have their catalytic converters engraved with their vehicles' identification numbers or be otherwise permanently marked so the converter could be identified if removed and attempted to be sold to a scrap yard or converter processing facility.

The Herald quotes a state representative who says the lack of individual identification on converters makes it nearly impossible for law enforcement agencies to determine if a converter is stolen or legitimately scrapped property.

### Precious metals yield atrocious behavior

At an <u>ISRI2021</u> online workshop, ISRI Director of Law Enforcement Outreach, Brady Mills, cited National Insurance Crime Bureau statistics showing that while in 2018 catalytic converter theft claims average 118 per month, by December 2020 that figure reached 2,347 such claims filed.

Butch Bryant of the Knox County, TN, sheriff's office quoted bank robber Willie Sutton, who when asked why he robbed banks replied, "Because that's where the money is." In April 2021, platinum is worth \$1,200 per ounce, palladium \$2,500 and rhodium a whopping \$28,000 per ounce. To a thief, that's where the money is.

Bryant said Knox Co. has interrupted such transactions in a superstore parking lot. Perhaps more worrying was a case in an adjacent county where a catalytic converter thief attempted to run down an officer, said Bryant, causing the officer to shoot and wound the suspect.

Referencing earlier efforts to reduce theft of air conditioner cores as a template to address the converter theft problem, one county in the South has

tested a program where vehicle owners have the option of having an identification tag and a bright, painted sheriff's logo placed onto converters.

Bryant said of thieves who confront a converter marked that way, "When they get underneath that fleet vehicle

and see that big, marked Knox County Sheriff's star, they're going to go elsewhere." (Bryant singled out truck, bus and van fleet owners because they are frequent victims of catalytic converter theft and can be willing participants in a marking program.)

"Recyclers are often the ones who tell us, 'Here's what's going on, here's who's doing it,'" said Bryant of recyclers providing information on stolen material sellers and buyers. "I challenge law enforcement officers to get out there and develop that relationship with your local recyclers. None of the legitimate recyclers like the stigma of being associated with these catalytic converter thefts."

ARA Advocates for ROE Parts as Average Age of Vehicles in Operation Increases to 12.1 Years

ARA issued a press release in June calling on vehicle owners, repair facilities and insurance companies to increase utilization of ROE - Recycled Original Equipment® automotive parts as the average age of light vehicles in operation rises to 12.1 years.

In response to new research from IHS Market, a research firm that delivers an annual report on the age of vehicles on the road in the United States, ARA took the opportunity to remind consumers that they
